• Increase Communication and community engagement

Cellular Service Area Signs installation

POD system set up

- o Held POD leader meetings
- Recruiting more POD leaders and increasing the capacity of PODs that currently have leaders
- PODs were very effective in improving communication and response time when responding to wildfires during the summer

• Community Response trailers

- The trailers purchased by Cheslatta Carrier Nation were once again a valuable tool in fighting fires and training activities
- Anyone can use them in an emergency situation not just the people who are storing them
- Working with Cheslatta to improve them and develop systems for the maintenance of the trailers

Increase engagement with local government, Wildfire BC and volunteer fire department

- o Joined the Hazard, Risk and vulnerability Analysis group through RDBN
- Met with Southside Volunteer Fire Department to work on increased collaboration between the two organizations
